## A Grateful Acknowledgment

To the City: For more than a century, the City of New York and the Trustees of The Metropolitan Museum of Art have been partners in bringing the Museum's services to the public. The complex of buildings in Central Park is the property of the City, and the City provides for the Museum's heat, light, and power.
