Final Preparations for diane arbus: in the beginning

There is a great deal of science behind preparing photographs for exhibition and ensuring their safety while on view and during transit to other locations. For the upcoming exhibition, *diane arbus: in the beginning*, photographs were secured into "sealed packages" to maintain beneficial environmental conditions for each print. Pictured here, conservator Katie Sanderson trims the metal-plastic foil that keeps the matted photograph isolated from outside air. The colorful textile-covered bags on the center of the glazed photograph are light weights used to hold the package in place during sealing. We hope to see you all at The Met Breuer, where this exhibition of Diane Arbus' early work opens on July 12.




New Publication on 30 Years of Photograph Conservation

The new book *Conservation of Photographs: Thirty Years of Science* includes fourteen papers by leaders in the field, presented at the 2011 international conference held in Logroño, Spain, organized by Ángel M. Fuentes and hosted by the Casa de la Imagen. The volume opens with an introduction by Grant Romer, followed by papers on the evolution of conservation treatment; the impact of scientific research on preservation; issues in analog and digital color photography; advances in graduate conservation education; collections care management; and the role of the conservator in museums. Digital Print Workshop

This past April, staff from the departments of Photograph Conservation, Paper Conservation, Imaging, and Photographs participated in a 3-day intensive workshop about digital prints. Under the brilliant tutelage of Daniel Burge of the Image Permanence Institute (IPI) (pictured), Met staff learned a wealth of invaluable information about the history, identification, and structure of digital prints. Because of the variable nature of the media and the speed with which the many digital print processes and derivatives evolve, it is clear that workshops of this type will continue to be essential in keeping conservators and collections care professionals up-todate.
